Learning the 'Bible stories' that aren't in the Bible

Congratulations to our 2nd/3rd grade students who led our services so beautifully in February. During the (typically) sermon portion of the service, the students did skits to illustrate two of the values, Gevurah (strength) and B'tzelem Elohim (the idea that we are all made in the image of God) that they learned this year.

A month or so ago, I was visiting with this same 2nd/3rd grade class. Their teacher, Rebecca, was teaching the students about the Jewish body of literature known as Midrash. I happen to really like Midrash and joined in the conversation. For reference, there are several stories with which you might be familiar that you likely think are from the Torah/Bible (I did), but they are not. One of them is the story about Abraham and the idols. Another story is about Moses and how he reached for the hot coals and not the shiny jewels that Pharoah offered him as a child. I was quite confused the first time I actually sat down to read a translation of the Torah and found these wellknown stories missing. I learned they are often taught to children as "Bible stories" and found them in many children's books marked as such.

So, Rebecca explained that

what is contained in Midrash are the stories that "fill in the blanks." Moses' story about the hot coals and how he brought one to his lips was created to explain why he stutters. The story of Abraham and the idols sheds light on Abraham as a child and shows him having an understanding of One God from a young age.

After listening to this explanation, one of the students put it more succinctly. Her eyes got wide and she responded, "Oh, it is the back story."Yeah, that works.

Coming up we have our Community Shabbat at the

beginning of March and then after a few changes needed to be made, our Gan class and our 4th/5th grades classes will both be leading us in our Shabbat services in April.

Watch for information about the Purim Carnival, scheduled to take place on Sunday, March 24.
